Over a period of time our rituals have undergone some change and new rituals/variants of existing rituals for some specific occasions have been developed. On an ongoing basis, it will be our endeavour to update this book to include such developments, making this book the ultimate handbook of masonic ceremonies; one that every brother with an interest in the ritual should necessarily own.

CEREMONY OF LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE OF A MASONIC TEMPLE

General Instructions:

- The Diagrams give the general lay out of the arrangements at the site; the seating arrangement for M. W. The Grand Master and his participating officers, for the representatives of the Masonic Fraternity, and for the ladies, gentlemen and brethren; the position of tables and such other furniture for keeping cushions, consecrating vessels and Vs. of S.L.; and directions regarding how these should be arranged.
- Cushions are required, one each for the phial containing coins, phial containing suitable souvenirs of the period, inscription plate, trowel, maul, plumb rule, level, square, building plans and for each of the five Vs. of S.L; numbering 14 in all. The four consecrating vessels shall have been previously placed on the long table kept for that purpose.
- The Foundation Stone shall be laid at the North-East Corner of the premises.
- 4. The Pit, Tripod, Pulley and the Foundation Stone shall, as far as possible, be as per the details in the diagram.
- R. W. The Regional Grand Master, the W. Master of the Lodge and the Chairman of the Building Committee shall be part of the Grand Lodge Procession.

- Brethren should robe themselves before proceeding to their seats at the Ceremonial Site.
- Brethren other than those in the Procession and Ladies and Gentlemen should take their seats 15 Minutes before the Ceremony is scheduled to commence.
- All should stand when:
 - M. W. The Grand Master and his Officers in the Procession enter and retire before and after the Ceremony respectively.
 - b) The Vs of S.L. are opened and closed
 - c) The Grand Chaplain renders the Prayers
 - The Ceremony of Laying of Foundation Stone is conducted by M. W. The Grand Master
 - e) The National Anthem is sung.

ORDER OF PROCEDURE

- The G. D. of C. assisted by his Deputy and Assistant will form the Procession, according to the G.L. rank of each brother with juniors in the front and seniors at the rear. Apart from the Consecration Vessels, all the other items should be carried on cushions - 14 in all.
- The Deputation from Grand Lodge and the Management Committee of the Masonic Fraternity of the Lodge will arrive in procession at the site.

- As the Procession arrives everyone will stand & resume their seats only after M. W. The Grand Master takes his seat.
- M. W. The Grand Master and the Officers accompanying him will be conducted to their seats by the G. D. of C. and his Deputy.
- 5. Bearers of W.T.s will place the W.T.s on the long table.
- The Superintendent of Works shall place the plan on the table.
- Grand Chaplain followed by G. Brs. of Vs of S.L. will form in front of M. W. The G. M. The G. D. of C. assisted by his Deputy will take the Vs. of S.L. and place them on the Altar.
- The G. D. of C., assisted by his Deputy will take the cushions from Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer and place them on the long table.
- As and when Brethren are relieved of their cushions, they will proceed to their allotted seats.
- The Vs. of S.L. will be opened by the G. D. of C. All brethren and visitors will stand.
- The W.M. of the Lodge will address the assembly and invite M.W. The G.M. to lay the Foundation Stone.

- M.W. The Grand Master may, if he wishes, give an introductory address on the nature and purpose of the Institution of Freemasonry.
- The G.D. of C., assisted by his Deputy will escort M.W.
 The Grand Master, and the Dy. G.M. to the Foundation Stone pit.
- 14. M.W. The G.M. directs that the Stone be raised. The Stone is raised with a block and tackle by the Clerk of Works and the Foreman in three distinct stages.
- 15. M.W. The G.M. addresses the meeting: "Ladies, Gentlemen and Brethren assembled here today to behold this ceremony, know all of you that we the lawful Masons, true and faithful to the laws of our country; and established of old with peace and honour in most countries, and engaged by solemn obligations to erect magnificent buildings to be serviceable to the Brethren and to the Glory of God, the G.A.O.T.U..

We are here assembled today, in the presence of you all, to assist in laying in ancient form, the Foundation Stone of this Building as a house for Masonry in general and for the members of Lodge _____ No.___ in particular, which, we pray to God, may prosper by becoming a place of concord for good men and for the promotion of Harmony and Brotherly Love throughout the World, until

time with us shall be no more. Before I proceed with laying the Foundation Stone, I call upon the Chaplain to give the Opening Prayer."

- G. D. of C.: To order, Ladies, Gentlemen & Brethren. (All visitors and Brethren will stand while the Grand Chaplain gives the prayer.)
- 16. Grand Chaplain: "Almighty and Eternal God, G.A.O.T.U., who dost from Thy Throne behold all dwellers upon Earth, direct us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name".

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

- 17. Grand Treasurer, Grand Registrar and Grand Secretary will form up facing MW The G.M..
 - (The G.D. of C. and his Deputy will have the phials ready on cushions)
- M.W. The G.M. proceeds to the Stone and calls upon those bearing the phials, to announce the contents and place them in the cavity.
- The Grand Treasurer will place the phial in the cavity after announcing its contents and return to his seat. The phial should normally contain a full set of the latest coinage.

- 20. The Grand Registrar will place the second phial in the cavity after announcing its contents and return to his seat. The phial should contain suitable souvenirs of the date, eg. a copy of the local paper, Invitation for the Foundation Stone Laying Ceremony, Latest Summons of the Lodge, the current appeal for funds and other appropriate literature, such as an order of procedure for the Ceremony.
- 21. M.W. The G.M. will ask the Grand Secretary to read the inscription on the plate and cover the cavity with the plate.

Grand Secretary does so and returns to his seat, The inscription on the plate, if any, should record the same information as is displayed on the Stone itself, together with the names of the Architect and Builder.

- 22. A workman with cement on a board will be conducted to the right of M.W. The G.M. The G. Bearers of W.Ts. will form up on the left of the M.W. The G.M. who will be given the W.T.s on cushions by the Assistant G. D. of C.
- M.W. The G.M. is offered the Trowel by its Bearer; he takes
 it and spreads cement on the lower stone, i.e., to cover
 the plate.

The mortar board is brought forward at the same time as the MW The G.M. is offered the Trowel. After use, M.W. The G.M. places the Trowel back on the cushion and takes the Maul.

24. M.W. The G.M. will direct that the Stone be lowered. The Stone is then lowered into place in three distinct stages and adjusted by MW The G.M. with the Maul. MW The G.M. adjusts the Stone by striking it at each of the four corners with the Maul saying:

"With Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice may our work be well founded".

He then returns the Maul to its Bearer.

 MW The G.M.: "Brother Junior Grand Warden, you will apply the Plumb Rule to prove the Stone".

The Junior Grand Warden proves the Stone plumb and reports: "M.W. The G.M., I find the Stone perfect and trustworthy; the Craftsmen have done their duty".

The J.G.W. replaces the P.R. on the Cushion and proceeds to his place.

 M.W. The G.M. says: "Brother Senior Grand Warden, you will apply the Level to prove the Stone" The Senior Grand Warden proves the Stone level and reports: "M.W. The G.M., I find the Stone to be well founded; the Craftsmen have done their duty".

The S.G.W. replaces the Level on the Cushion and proceeds to his place.

 M.W. The G.M.: "Brother Deputy Grand Master, you will prove the Stone Square".

The Deputy Grand Master proves the Stone Square by applying the Square to one of its angles and reports: "M.W. The G.M., I have applied the Square, and find the Stone to be true; the Craftsmen have done their duty".

The Dy. G.M. replaces the square on the Cushion.

28. The Dy. Grand Master presents the Maul to M.W. The G.M. who receives it, and then says: "Having full confidence in your skill in the Royal Art, it now remains with me to complete the work".

He then strikes the Stone three times with the Maul, saying : "By the power in me vested and in the name of the G.A.O.T.U., I declare this Stone well and truly laid and in accordance with Antient Rules of Architecture".

(MW The G.M. returns the Maul to the Dy. G.M. who replaces it to the cushion. Dy. G. D. of C. takes the cushions with the W.Ts. and returns them to their places and proceeds to his seat. Bearers of W.T.s return to their seats as and when they are relieved of their cushions.)

29. The Grand Superintendent of Works will present the plans for the inspection and approval of M.W. The G.M. saying: "M.W. The G.M., I present to you the plans of the proposed building for your inspection and approval".

M.W. The G.M. takes the plans in his hands saying: "I will do so with pleasure." He returns the plans after inspection saying: "With the implements of our Craft and with these instructions, may there be raised a superstructure, perfect in its parts and honourable to its builders".

- The G. D. of C. hands the Vessel containing Corn to M.W. The G.M. saying: "M.W. The Grand Master, I present to you corn, the sacred emblem of Plenty".
- 31. M.W. The G.M. scatters Corn on the Stone saying: "I scatter Corn on this Stone, the emblem of Plenty; May the all-bounteous Creator of the Universe shower down His Choicest blessings on the members of this Community and all who shall assemble in this building to the Glory of the Most High, until time with us shall be no more".

G. D. of C.: Brethren will now sing together.

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

- The G. D. of C. hands the Vessel containing Wine to the M.W. The G.M. saying, "M.W. The Grand Master, I present to you Wine, the sacred emblem of Joy and Cheerfulness".
- 33. M.W. The G.M. pours Wine on the Stone, saying: "I pour Wine on this Stone, the emblem of Joy and Cheerfulness and may He Whose Name is Love, grant that we may be all of one heart and mind and may we ever dwell together in peace and unity".

G. D. of C.: Brethren will now sing together.

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

- G. D. of C. hands the Vessel containing Oil to M.W. The G.M. saying: "MW The Grand Master, I present to you Oil, the Sacred emblem of Charity".
- 35. M.W. The G.M. pours Oil on the Stone saying, "I pour Oil on this Stone, the emblem of Charity and may God give us grateful hearts and may we be ever ready, cheerfully to relieve the wants of others".

G. D. of C.: Brethren will now sing together.

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

 G. D. of C. hands the Vessel contained Salt to M.W. The G.M. saying: "M.W. The Grand Master, I present to you Salt, the sacred emblem of Hospitality and Friendship".

- 37. M.W. The G.M. sprinkles Salt on the Stone saying, "I sprinkle Salt on this Stone, the emblem of Hospitality and Friendship and may the all-bounteous Author of Nature bless this town, State, Region and Republic at large with abundance of Corn, Wine and Oil and all necessities, comforts and conveniences of life. And may the Almighty Architect of the Universe look down with benignity upon our present undertaking and crown the edifice of which we have now laid the foundation, with every success".
 - G. D. of C.: Brethren will now sing together.

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

G. D. of C.: To order, Ladies, Gentlemen and Brethren.

(All visitors and Brethren will stand with Sn. of R. while the Grand Chaplain gives the Prayer and Benediction.)

PRAYER

38. Grand Chaplain: "Bless, we beseech Thee, the work we have this day begun in Thy name. May the Edifice about to be erected on this Foundation Stone be completed to Thy Honour and Glory, and may those who shall hereafter use this building, dedicate and devote their lives to Thy Service, and evermore praise and magnify Thy Most Holy Name".

BENEDICTION

 Grand Chaplain: "May the G.A.O.T.U. bless, preserve and keep us evermore; may He lift up the light of His Countenance upon us, and give us peace, now and for evermore".

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

(All visitors and Brethren resume their seats.)

- 40. G. D. of C., assisted by his Deputy escorts M.W. The G.M. and R.W. The Dy. G.M. to their seats.
- R.W. The Regional Grand Master may address the Assembly.
- 42. M.W. The Grand Master may address the Assembly.
- 43. The Grand Secretary proposes a vote of thanks.
- 44. G. D. of C. calls everyone to order.
- 45. The Vs. of S.L. are closed by the G. D. of C.
- After the National Anthem, the G. D. of C. requests everybody to be seated and forms the retiring Procession.
- G. D. of C. calls everyone to order while the Procession retires, saying: "Ladies, Gentlemen and Brethren kindly be upstanding while M.W. The G.M. retires."

ANNEXURE

ARRANGEMENTS:

- 1. SEATING ARRANGEMENTS (SEE DIAGRAM A):
 - Entire area has to be leveled and cleaned.
 - b. 14 chairs to face South with a Table. Seats to be provided for other Officers as given in Diagram A.
 - c. Altar with a Kneeling Stool
 - Adequate number of seats for Ladies and Gentlemen; and Brethren separated by a 10 ft. wide passage in the Centre, the visitors to face North.
- PITS AND TRIPOD FOR LAYING FOUNDATION STONE (SEE DIAGRAM B):
 - A Foundation Pit to be made at the North East corner of the land with a dimension of about 6 ft. length and 6ft. breadth and 2 ft. depth.
 - b. Inner Pit of a dimension of about 1 ft. 6 inches length and 1ft. 6 inches breadth with a depth of about 1 ft.
 - Steps to be provided in the Outer Pit to descend from the Ground level to Inner Pit.
- 3. FOUNDATION STONE (ROUGH GRANITE OR RCC SLAB):
 - a. Foundation Stone of a size of 1 ft. 6 inches length and 1 ft. 6 inches breadth with a thickness of about 2 or 3 inches

 The Foundation Stone should appropriately fit into Inner Pit.

4. TRIPOD:

- a. A Tripod to be erected with a thick rope and a Pulley.
- One end of the Rope to be tied with the Foundation Stone. (When the Rope is released, the Foundation Stone should suitably fit into the Inner Pit).
- Adequate space should be provided in front of the Outer Pit to enable the Visitors to come closer and witness the Ceremony.
- A Long Table to be provided behind the Outer Pit for placing the Cushions, Vessels and Working Tools.

AREA FOR REFRESHMENTS. IF ANY:

Refreshment Area, if any, to be provided at the South West End of the Land.

6. GENERAL:

- a. Adequate Lighting arrangements to be made.
- b. Mike and Sound System.
- c. Video Filming, if necessary.
- d. Reserved area for the Press in the Visitors' Area.
- e. Mortar Board, Cement, Sand, Trowel, Water, etc.

7. ROBING AREA:

- The Robing Area covered with shamiana / cloth walls to be provided at the South East part of the land.
- Adequate number of tables to be provided inside the Robing Area for placing Apron boxes, Cushions, Working Tools, etc.

8. A PLAQUE/POLISHED GRANITE STONE:

A Plaque / Polished Granite Stone with the following Inscription is to be made:


9. ITEMS REQUIRED:

- a. Building plan for construction of the building.
- 14 Cushions for placing the Phials, Volumes of Sacred Law, Working Tools, Plan, etc.
- c. One Phial (Plastic with Cover) to contain Rupee Notes of Rs.100, Rs.50, Rs.20, Rs.10, Rs.5, Rs.2 and Re.1 and Coins of Rs.5, Rs.2, Re.1, 50p, 25p (whatever is available).
- d. One Phial to contain the Newspaper of the date, Souvenirs, Summons of the Lodge, Invitation for the Foundation Stone Laying ceremony, Directory of the Members of the Lodge, etc. (whatever is available).
- e. Five Vs. of S.L. preferably of equal size, Trowel, Maul, Plumb Rule, Level, Square.
- f. (Consecrating) Vessels with Corn, wine, oil and salt.

10. INSCRIPTION PLATE:

Inscription Plate (stainless steel preferable) of a size of about 1ft. 6 inches length and 1ft. 6 inches breadth to fit the Inner Pit with the same matter as contained in the Plaque described in item 8 above.



THE CEREMONY OF CONSECRATION OF A CRAFT LODGE

General Instructions:

- Consecrating team is a Grand Lodge team and shall therefore wear only the Grand Lodge Regalia.
- The G.D. of C. will form the ingoing procession in accordance with the seniority of protem office and not as per the seniority of individual rank.
- 3. The Consecrating Officer with the assistance of his team will open a casual Lodge. No separate team shall be formed for opening a casual Lodge. The Consecrating Officer, after occupying the Eastern Chair shall appoint the Protem Officers who will bow to the Consecrating Officer and proceed to their respective seats. The Lodge will be opened by the Consecrating Team in all the Three Degrees and the Ceremony of Consecration shall be done in the Third Degree.
- In the opening Ceremony the Consecrating Officer is to be addressed as W.M., and not as M.W., the Grand Master or R.W., the R.G.M. etc.
- The Consecrating Officer, if he so desires, may address the brethren immediately after the Ceremony of consecration, but before he hands over the charge to the Installing Officer.
- As the Consecrating Officers are relieved of their pro-tem offices', they will be seated on the dais on the right of the W.M., in accordance with their seniority and the Regalia they are wearing.

- After the installation, the W.M. should request any Past Master to act as I.P.M., but will not invest him.
- Brethren will remain standing during the four Circuits and Censing of the Lodge right up to the Benediction Prayer.
- The Treasurer and Tyler should be elected before the Investiture of Officers of the Lodge is taken up.
- The Bye-Laws of the Lodge should be first adopted in open Lodge before they are presented to the newly installed W.M.
- The G.D.of C, shall form the outgoing procession in accordance with the Seniority and the Regalia worn by Consecrating Officers.

Requisites

- 1. All normal properties and furniture of a Lodge.
- Consecrating vessels and censer (to be procured from respective R.G.Ls.)
- 3. Consecrating elements Corn, Wine, Oil and Salt.
- 4. Incense, Camphor and Match box.

- Four Saucers.
- 7. Charter or Warrant.

- 8. Book of Constitutions, Byelaws of the Regional Grand Lodge, draft bye-laws of the Lodge.
- Seats on the dias at the right of W.M., for Consecrating Officers.
- 10. Two seats in North-east for the G. D. of C. and his Dy.
- Seats for the petitioners in South-East. The Master and Wardens designate in front.

CEREMONIAL

G. D. of C. (At Lodge door): Upstanding Brethren to receive the Consecrating Officer, M.W.

Bro.....accompanied by the Consecrating Officers.

The Consecrating Officers, Juniors leading enter in pairs, open out, halt and turn inwards. The Consecrating Officer (CO.) appoints his Officers, protem. Each in turn bows and proceeds direct to his place unescorted. The Consecrating Officer, after occupying the E chair opens the Lodge in all the Three Degrees. (Tracing Boards are not opened). The G. D. of C. then calls upon the brethren to salute the CO.

CO.: Brethren, we have assembled here for the laudable purpose of consecrating a new Lodge and constituting it into a Lodge of Free and

Accepted Masons so that it may act as a regular Lodge and initiate, pass and raise candidates for freemasonry and perform rites and ceremonies conformably with our Antient Charges and the Constitutions of the Order. We are pleased and happy to have the opportunity to welcome this addition to our family. Before I proceed with the ceremony of consecration, I call upon the Chaplain to give the opening prayer.

G. D. of C.: To order brethren

(All give Sn. Of R.)

Chap.: "O Lord our Heavenly Father, Architect and Ruler

of the Universe, who dost from Thy throne behold all dwellers upon earth, direct us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy

Most Holy name".

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G. D. of C.: Be seated brethren.

(G. D. of C. from the front of S.W.'s chair and with

no Sn. addresses the CO)

G. D. of C.: Most Worshipful the C.O., a number of brethren duly instructed in the mysteries of the Craft, who are now assembled, have requested me to inform you of their gratitude that you, M.W. The Grand Master have been pleased to grant them a Charter a warrant of Constitution bearing (date)..... corresponding to theSaka Era authorizing them to form and open a Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons, to be known as Lodgebearing No...... on the Register of Grand Lodge of India to meet at.....in the Region of Northern/Eastern/Southern/Western India and are desirous that this Lodge be consecrated and their officers invested and installed according to the ancient usages and established customs of the Order for which purpose they are now assembled and await your pleasure.

(If someone other than MW The G.M. is C.O., then for the words "MW" substitute the words "RW" and for the words "you, M.W. The Grand Master have", substitute "MW the G.M. has")

CO: I will thank the brethren who signed the petition to stand in the body of the Lodge while the Grand Secretary reads the Warrant or Charter.

D of C: The petitioners will stand in the East, the Master Designate in front, with the S.W. Designate on his right and J.W. Designate on his left and the other petitioners formed behind, all facing East.

(The G. D. of C. leads the Master Designate and the Wardens Designate to their positions in the East and then arranges the brethren behind them. He shows the Warrant to the CO. and then hands it over to the Grand Secretary, who reads the Warrant.)

CO.: After due deliberation, and by virtue of the authority vested in me, I, as The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of India, have granted to the brethren of this new Lodge a Warrant establishing in them all the rights and privileges of our Order, and I now enquire of the Petitioners whether they approve of the officers named in the Warrant to preside over them.

(If someone other than M.W. the Grand Master is the CO. then for the words "and by virtue of the authority vested in me, I, as The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of India have" substitute the words "M.W. The Grand Master, by virtue of the authority vested in him as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of India has") (The Petitioners, other than the Master and the Wardens Designate signify their approval by the Sn. of F.)

C.O.: Then we will proceed to constitute these brethren into a regular Lodge, and to consecrate it in accordance with ancient usages and customs.

(G. D. of C. leads the Master Designate and the Wardens Designate to their places)

D of C: Pertioners, resume your seats. Be seated brethren.

C.O.: I will now call upon the Chaplain to deliver an Oration on the nature and purpose of our Institution.

THE ORATION (The Chap, delivers the Oration)

G. D. of C.: To order brethren. (All stand with Sn. of R.)

DEDICATION PRAYER FIRST PART

Chap.: Let us pray. Almighty Father of the Universe, Searcher and Ruler of all worlds, deign from Thy celestial abode, from realms of light and glory, to bless us in all purposes of our assembly. We humbly beseech Thee to give us wisdom in all our doings, strength of mind in all our difficulties, and the

beauty of love and harmony in all our communications. Permit us, O Thou Author of light and life, Great Source of love and happiness, to erect this Lodge and solemnly to consecrate it to the honour and glory of Thy Most Holy Name.

G. D. of C.: The brethren will assume an attitude of prayer, turning to the East.

THE INVOCATION

CO.: O Lord God, Supreme thou art in heaven above and on earth beneath, who keepeth thy covenant and showeth mercy unto Thy servants who bow before Thee with all their hearts. Let all the people of the earth know that the Lord, He is God, and that there is none else. Let all the people of the earth know thy name and revere Thee. Let all the people of the earth know that we have built this House and are consecrating it to Thy service. But will Thou, O God, indeed, dwell upon the earth? Behold the heavens and the heaven of heavens cannot contain Thee, how much less this House that we have built?

(The CO. places himself on the east of the Lodge Boards, facing west with the S.W. on his right and the J.W. on his left. (See Diagram) The G. D. of C. hands the cornucopia filled with corn to the CO., the vessel containing wine to the S.W. and that containing oil to the J.W. bowing to each after doing so.)

First Circuit

CO. (followed by the S.W. and J.W. in that order, perambulates, saying): I scatter corn upon this Lodge, the symbol of abundance and plenty. May

the good seed of His word sink into the hearts of men, take root and bring forth fruit a hundred fold.

(All three return to east, and stand facing west as before.)

G. D. of C.: Brethren will sing together

Musical /

Omnes: Glory be to God on High

Second Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the cornucopia from the CO. and hands the vessel containing wine to the CO., the vessel containing oil to the S.W. and the cornucopia to the J.W. bowing to each after he has done so.)

CO (followed by Wardens as before, perambulates, saying): I pour wine upon this Lodge, the symbol of joy and gladness. May we ever rejoice in the revelation of truth and may virtue flourish as the wine.

(All three return to the east, and stand facing west as before).

G. D. of C.: Brethren will sing together

Musical/

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

Third Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the vessel containing wine from the CO. and hands that containing oil to the CO., the vessel containing wine to the J.W. and the cornucopia to the S.W.)

(CO. followed by W.s, as before perambulates saying): I sprinkle oil upon this Lodge, the symbol of peace and harmony. May the peace that passeth all understanding descend from heaven upon you and abide with you for evermore.

(All three return to the east, and stand facing west as before).

G.D. of C.: Brethren will sing together.

(The G. D. of C. receives the consecrating vessels from the CO. and the Wardens, and replaces them on the table. He then hands the vessel containing salt, to the CO.)

G. D. of C.: The petitioners will stand round the Lodge Board, the Master and Wardens Designate at the east, all facing outwards.

Fourth Circuit

(The Director or Deputy Director of Ceremonies having previously directed the Tyler to prepare the censer obtains it from him. When the censer is brought into the Lodge, the Chaplain comes and stands in front of the CO. to receive the censer from the G. D. of C.)

Perambulations

(The Chaplain perambulates the Lodge three times in a slow march waving the censer so as to disperse the incense)

First Perambulation (Censing the Lodge)

(The Chap, bows to the CO., turns right and proceeds down the Lodge reciting the following words in slow rhythm.)

"And Aaron shall burn thereon sweet incense".

(He halts in front of the J.W., faces north and swings the censer twice, slowly walks over to the west, halts in front of the S.W., faces east and swings the censer twice; proceeds in a slow walk along the north, halts opposite and in line with the J.W.'s Chair, faces south and swings the censer twice. He then slowly walks over to the east, halts in front of the CO. and faces him.) (See Diagram)

Second Perambulation (Censing the CO)

(The Chap, bows to the C.O., censes him three times and bows again. He then turns right and proceeds down the Lodge reciting the following)

"Every morning when he dresseth the Lamps, he shall burn incense upon it."

(He halts in front of S.W., faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He continues round the Lodge until he is in the north, opposite the J.W. He halts, faces the J.W., bows, censes him once across and over the Lodge Boards, and bows again. He then goes back to his position in the east.) (See Diagram).

Third Perambulation (Censing the Master, Wardens Designate and brethren generally)

(The Chap, bows to the C.O., turns right and halts in front of the Master Designate, the S.W. Designate and J.W. Designate in that order on the front row at the East of J.W.'s pedestal. He faces the Master Designate, bows, censes him three times and bows again. He then moves to the front of the S.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He then moves

to the front of the J.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him once and bows again. He then proceeds round the Lodge slowly reciting the following words)

"And when Aaron lighteth the lamps at even, he shall burn incense upon it.

(The Chap, proceeds to the West and halts in front of the S.W.'s pedestal facing east, he half turns to his right towards the south-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He next turns left towards north-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He finally faces the East, bows, censes the brethren in the east once, and then proceeds onwards along the north reciting the following words) (See Diagram)

"A perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generation."

(He comes back to his starting position in the east, faces the CO., bows to him, hands the censer to the G.D. of C and returns to his seat. The Dy. G.D. of C takes the censer out of the Temple.)

G. D. of C .: To order brethren.

(All stand with Sn. of R.)

DEDICATION PRAYER SECOND PART

Chap: Grant, O lord, that those who are now about to be invested with the government of this Lodge may

- The Consecrating Officer, if he so desires, may address the companions immediately after the Ceremony of consecration, but before he hands over the charge to the Installing Officer.
- As the Consecrating Officers are relieved of their pro-tem offices, they will be seated on the dais at the right in accordance with their seniority and Regalia they are wearing.

I will thank the Companions who have signed the Petition to stand in the body of the Chapter whilst the Grand Scribe 'E.' reads the Warrant or Charter.

D. of C: The Petitioners will stand in the West, the First Principal-Designate in the front, the Second Principal-Designate on his right, the Third Principal-Designate on his left, and the other Petitioners formed behind, all facing East.

(G. D. of C. goes to the three Principals-Designate and leads them to their places, the others following. He gives the Warrant to C. 1st Prin. for inspection and returns it to the Grand Scribe E., who reads it aloud.)

C.1st Prin.: After due consideration, I, as the First Grand Principal, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Supreme Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of India, have granted to the Companions of this New Chapter, a Warrant establishing in them all the rights and privileges of our Order and I must now enquire of the petitioners whether they approve of the officers named in the warrant to preside over them.

(If someone other than ME The I.G. Prin. is the C.O., then for the words "I as I.G. Prin. by virtue of the authority vested in me" substitute the words "M.E. The I.G. Prin., by virtue of the authority in him vested" and substitute the word "have" by "has")

(Petitioners other than the Principals-Designate, signify their approval by the Sn. of F.)

C. 1st Prin.: Then we will proceed to constitute these Companions into a Regular Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in accordance with the ancient usage and custom.

G. D. of C. (leads the three designate to their seats.): The Petitioners, resume your seats. Be seated comps.

C.1st Prin.: I now call upon the C.3rd Prin. to deliver an oration on the nature and purpose of our institution.

(C.3rd Prin. delivers the oration.)

G. D. of C.: To order companions for the first part of the Dedication Prayer.

G. D. of C.: To order Comps. with Sn. of R.

Dedication Prayer – First Part

C.3rd Prin.:

Let us pray. Almighty Architect of the Universe, Searcher and Ruler of all worlds, deign from Thy celestial abode, from the realms of light and glory, to bless us in all the purposes of our assembly. We humbly beseech Thee to give us wisdom in all our doings, strength of mind in all our difficulties and the beauty of love and harmony in all our communications.

Permit us, O Thou Author of light and life, Great Source of love and happiness to constitute this Chapter, and now solemnly, to consecrate it to the honour and glory of Thy Most Holy Name.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G.D. of C: The Companions will assume an attitude of prayer, turning to the East. (Sn. of R.)

THE INVOCATION

C.1st Prin.:

O Thou T.A.L.G.M.H., supreme Thou art in heaven above and earth beneath, who keepeth thy covenant and showeth mercy unto thy servants who bow before Thee with all their hearts.

Let all the people of the earth know that the Lord, he is God, and that there is none else.

Let all the people of the earth know Thy name and revere Thee. Let all the people of the earth know that we have built this house and are consecrating it to Thy service. But will Thou, O God, indeed dwell upon the earth? Behold, the heavens, and the heaven of heavens, cannot contain Thee, how much less this house which we have built?

C.1st Prin.: Let the candles be lit.

(The G. D. of C. lights the candles. C.2nd and 3rd Prins. carrying their scepters unveil the altar).

(The C. Prins. place themselves in the East of the Chapter facing West, the C.2nd Prin. on the right, and the C.3rd Prin. on the left of the C.1st Prin. The G. D. of C. hands the cornucopia filled with corn to the C.1st Prin., the vessel containing wine to the C.2nd Prin. and the vessel containing oil to the C.3rd Prin., bowing to each after he does so.)

The First Circuit

(The C.1st Prin. followed by the C.2nd Prin. and C.3rd Prin. in that order, perambulates round the ensigns saying):

C.1st Prin.: I scatter corn upon this Chapter, the symbol of abundance and plenty. May the good seed of His word sink into the hearts of men, take root and bring forth fruit a hundred fold. G. D. of C. (When all three have returned to the East.): The Companions will sing together.

Musical /

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High."

The Second Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the cornucopia from the C.1st Prin. and hands the vessel containing wine to the C.1st Prin. and hands the vessel containing oil to the C.2nd Prin. and the cornucopia to the C.3rd Prin. bowing to each after doing so. The C.1st Prin., followed by the other prins. as before, perambulates round the ensigns saying)

C.1st Prin.: I pour wine upon the Chapter, the symbol of joy and gladness. May we ever rejoice in the revelation

of truth and may virtue flourish as the wine.

G. D. of C.: (When all three have returned to the East).

Comps will sing together.

Musical /

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High."

The Third Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the vessel containing wine from the C.1st Prin. and hands that

containing oil to the C.1st Prin.; the vessel containing cornucopia to the C.2nd Prin.; wine to the C.3nd Prin, bowing to each, after doing so. The C.1st Prin., followed by other Prins. as before, perambulates round the ensigns, saying)

C.1st Prin.:

I sprinkle oil on this Chapter, the symbol of peace and harmony. May the peace that passeth all understanding descend from heaven upon you and abide with you forevermore.

G. D. of C.: (When all three have returned to the East.) : Comps. will sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High."

(The G. D. of C. receives the consecrating vessels from the three C. Prins. and replaces them on the table. He then hands the vessel containing salt to the C.1st Prin.)

G.D. of C: The petitioners will stand around the ensigns facing outwards, the three prins. Designate in the East. (see diagram)

(G. D. of C. then leads the three Prins. Designate to their places in the East, the others following)

The Fourth Circuit

(The C.1st Prin. now perambulates alone - see diagram)

C.1st Prin.: I strew salt upon this Chapter, the symbol of

fidelity, hospitality and everlasting friendship. May these virtues ever continue to distinguish the members of this Chapter, until time with them shall

be no more.

G. D. of C.: (When the C.1st Prin. has returned to the East.)

Comps will sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High."

(G. D. of C. receives the vessel of salt, from the C.1" Prin. and replaces it on the table. The consecrating Principals resume their places.)

G.D. of C: To Order companions.

C.1st Prin.: To the T.A.L.G.M.H. and to His service we dedicate

this Chapter (drop Sn. of R), also to the memory of the three original Grand Principals under whose auspices, many of our mysteries are said to have

had their origin.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G. D. of C. (leads the three Prins. Designate to their places): Petitioners, resume your places, but remain standing.

(C.3rd Prin. goes to the floor of the Chapter in front of the C.O., bows to him, and waits to receive the censer from the D of C. D of C or Dy. D of C, having previously directed the Janitor to prepare the censer obtains it from him and hands it to him. The C.3rd Prin. perambulates the Chapter three times, waving the censer so as to disperse the incense.)

First Perambulation (Censing the Altar)

The Consecrating J bows to the Consecrating Officer, turns right and proceeds down the Chapter. He passes round the Altar, reciting the words of Scripture

"And Aaron shall burn thereon sweet incense"

and censing the Altar in the manner shown in the diagram, and then returns to his position in front of the Consecrating Officer.

Second Perambulation (Censing the Consecrating Principals)

The Consecrating J bows to the Consecrating Officer and censes him three times.

He bows again, and still standing in the centre, bows to Consecrating H, censes him twice, bows again. He bows to the Consecrating J's Chair, censes it once, bows, and proceeds round the Chapter reciting the appropriate words.

"Every morning, when he dresseth the lamps, he shall burn incense upon it"

Third Perambulation (Censing the Principals of the new Chapter and the Companions generally)

The Consecrating J bows to the Consecrating Officer, turns right and halts in front of the Principals of the new Chapter. He bows and censes the Z Designate three times and bows. He then, in the same way, censes the H Designate twice and the J Designate once.

The Consecrating J then moves down the Chapter, reciting the first half of the words,

"And when Aaron lighteth the lamps at even, he shall burn incense"

and halts in the West, facing East. Then, half turning to his right, he bows towards South East to the Companions and censes them once and bows. He then turns left, bows towards North East and censes the Companions on that side of the Chapter once and bows. Lastly he faces east, bows, and censes the Comps. in the East once, and bows. He then proceeds up the side of the Chapter reciting the second half of the words,

"A perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generation."

and back to his first position, where he bows again to the Consecrating I. Prin., and returns the censer to the D of C. and returns to his seat. Dy. D of C. takes the censor out of the chapter.

G. D. of C.: To order Companions. (All stand with Sn. of R.)

DEDICATION PRAYER - Second Part

C.3rd Prin.: Grant, O Lord, that those who are about to be now invested with the government of this Chapter, may be endued with wisdom to instruct their companions in all their duties. May brotherly love, relief and truth ever prevail amongst its members and may this bond of union increase and strengthen the several Chapters throughout the world.

Bless all our companions, whersoever dispersed over the face of the earth and water, and grant a speedy relief to all who are oppressed and distressed. We especially and affectionately commend to Thy special care and attention all the members of the fraternity. May they increase in knowledge of Thee and love of each other. And finally, may we finish our work here below with Thy approbation and then leave this earthly abode for the heavenly temple above, there to enjoy light, bliss and joy now and for evermore.

THE CEREMONY OF CONSECRATION OF A MARK LODGE

General Instructions:

- Consecrating team is a Grand Mark Lodge team and shall therefore wear only the Grand Mark Lodge Regalia.
- The G. D. of C. will form the ingoing procession in accordance with the seniority of pro-tem office (and not as per the seniority of individual rank).
- 3. The Consecrating Officer with the assistance of his team will open a casual Mark Lodge. No separate team shall be formed for opening a casual Mark Lodge. The Consecrating Officer, after occupying the Eastern Chair shall appoint the Protem Officers who will bow to the Consecrating Officer and proceed to their respective seats.
- In the opening Ceremony the Consecrating Officer is to be addressed as W.M., and not as M.W., the Grand Master or R.W., the R.G.M.M., etc.
- The Consecrating Officer, if so desires may address the brethren immediately after the Ceremony of Consecration, but before he hands over the charge to the Installing Officer.
- As the Consecrating Officers are relieved of their pro-tem offices, they will be seated on the dais on the right of the W.M., in accordance with their seniority and the regalia they are wearing.

- After the installation, the W.M. should request any Past Master to act as I.P.M., but will not invest him.
- Brethren will remain standing during the four Circuits and Censing of the Lodge right up to the Benediction Prayer.
- 9. The Treasurer and Tyler should be elected before the Investiture of Officers of the Lodge is taken up.
- The Bye-Laws of the Lodge should be first adopted in open Lodge before they are presented to the newly installed W.M.
- The G.D. of C., shall form the outgoing procession in accordance with the Seniority and the Regalia worn by Consecrating Officers.

Requisites:

- 1. All normal properties and furniture of a Mark Lodge.
- Consecrating vessels and censer (to be procured from respective R.G.Ls.)
- 3. Consecrating elements Corn, Wine, Oil and Salt.
- 4. Incense, Camphor and Match box.
- Two tables (one large one for the Lodge Board and one small one for the consecrating vessels).
- Two white table cloths.
- 7. Four Saucers.
- 8. Charter or Warrant.

 Book of Constitutions, Regional Grand Lodges, Draft by Laws of the Lodge.

Seating Arrangement:

- Seats on the dias at the right of W.M., for Consecrating Officers.
- 2. Two seats in North-east for the G. D. of C. and his Dy.
- Seats for the petitioners in South-East. The Master and Wardens designate in front.
- Overseers chair and pedestals are not to be placed in position during consecration. These should be easily available for placing immediately prior to Installation.

Ceremonial

(The Consecrating Officers, Juniors leading enter in pairs, open out, halt and turn inwards. The Consecrating Officer (CO.) after occupying his chair appoints his Officers, protem. Each in turn bows and proceeds direct to his place unescorted. The Consecrating Officer opens the Lodge. The Tracing Board is not opened. The G. D. of C. then calls upon the brethren to salute the CO.)

CO.:

Brethren, we have assembled here for the laudable purpose of Consecrating a New Mark Lodge and constituting it into a Lodge of Mark Master Masons so that it may act as a Regular Lodge, advance candidates for Mark Masonry and perform rites and ceremonies conformably with our ancient charges and the constitutions of the order. We are pleased and happy to have the opportunity to welcome this addition to our family. Before I proceed with the Ceremony of Consecration, I call upon the Chaplain to give the Opening Prayer.

G.D.of.C.: To Order brethren.

(Brethren stand with the Sn. Of R.)

Chap.:

O, G.O.O.T.U., vouchsafe Thy blessing on this our present assembly. Let this Mark Master Masons' Lodge, now about to be consecrated be established to Thy honour and glory. May its officers be endued with wisdom to discern and fidelity to pursue its true interests. May its members be ever mindful of the duty they owe to Thee, O God. Direct them in all their doings with Thy most gracious favour and further them with Thy continual help, that in all their works begun, continued and ended in Thee, they may glorify Thy Most Holy Name.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G. D. of C.: Be seated brethren.

G. D. of C.: (From the front of S.W.'s chair and with no Sn. Addressed the CO.): Most Worshipful the C.O., a number of brethren duly instructed in the mysteries of Mark Masonry who are now assembled, have requested me to inform you of their gratitude, that vou. M.W. The Grand Master, have been pleased to grant them a Charter or a Warrant of Constitution bearingof of Saka Era, authorizing them to form and open a Lodge of Mark Master Masons to be known as Mark Lodge..... bearing No..... in the Register of Grand Mark Lodge of India, to meet atin the region of Northern/Southern/ Eastern/Western India, and are desirous that their Lodge be consecrated and their officers invested and installed according to the ancient usages and established customs of the Order for which purpose they are now assembled and await your pleasure.

(Note: If the CO. is someone other than M.W. Grand Master then for the words "Most Worshipful" substitute the words "Right Worshipful" and for the words, "that you, as M.W. The Grand Master. have"

substitute the words "that M.W. The Grand Master, has".)

CO.: I will thank the brethren who have signed the petition to stand in the body of the Lodge while the Grand Secretary reads the Warrant or Charter.

G. D. of C.: The petitioners will stand in the East, with the Master Designate in front, the Senior Warden Designate on his right, the Junior Warden Designate on his left and the other petitioners formed behind them all facing East.

(The G. D. of C. goes to the Master and Wardens Designate and leads them to their places, the others following. He then shows the Warrant to the CO. and thereafter he hands it over to the Grand Secretary, who reads the Warrant out aloud).

CO.: After due consideration, I as the Grand Master, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India, have granted to the brethren of this New Lodge, a Warrant establishing in them all the rights and privileges of our order, and I must now enquire of the petitioners whether they approve of the Officers named in the Warrant to preside over them.

(If someone other than M.W. the Grand Master is the CO. then for the words "I, as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of India have by virtue of the authority vested in me" substitute the words "M.W. The Grand Master, by virtue of the authority vested in him as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of India has")

(Petitioners, other than the Master and the Wardens Designate, signify their approval by Sn of F.)

CO.: Then we will proceed to constitute these brethren into a Regular Lodge and to consecrate it according to ancient usages and customs.

G.D.of C: (G. D. of C. leads the Master and Wardens Designate to their seats.)

Petitioners be seated; be seated brethren.

CO.: I now call upon the Chaplain to deliver an Oration on the nature and purpose of the Institution.

ORATION

(The Chaplain delivers the Oration.)

D. of C: To Order brethren for the first part of the Dedication Prayer. (All stand with Sn. of R.)

DEDICATION PRAYER - First Part

Chap .:

Grant, O, Thou Most High, that our chief corner stone may be laid in holiness to the Lord; and when we meet here for the purpose of masonry, may we be guided by the rules and precepts of Thy holy law, and may they lead us through all the scenes of our checkered existence to a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. (The CO. followed by the S.W. and J.W. in that order) perambulates, saying:

"I scatter corn upon this Lodge, the symbol of abundance and plenty, may the good seed of' His word sink into the hearts of men, take root and bring forth fruit a hundred fold."

G. D. of C.: (When all three have returned to east).

The Brethren will sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High".

THE SECOND CIRCUIT

(The G. D. of C. takes the cornucopia from the CO. and hands over the vessel containing wine to the C.O..; the vessel containing oil to the S.W. and the cornucopia to the J.W., bowing to each of them after doing so.)

The CO. (followed by the wardens as before) perambulates saying:

"I pour wine upon this lodge, the symbol of joy and gladness. May we ever rejoice in the revelation of truth and may virtue flourish as the wine."

THE THIRD CIRCUIT

(The G. D. of C. takes the vessel containing wine from the CO. and hands that containing oil to the CO., the vessel containing wine to the J.W. and the cornucopia to the S.W., bowing to each of them after doing so.)

The CO. (followed by Wardens as before), perambulates saying:

"I sprinkle oil upon this Lodge, the symbol of peace and harmony. May the peace that passeth all understanding descend from heaven upon you and abide with you for evermore."

G. D. of C. : (When all three have returned to east),
The Brethren will sing together.

Musical /

Omnes: "Glory be God on High".

(The G. D. of C. receives the consecrating vessels from the CO., the S.W. and J.W. and replaces them on the table. He then hands the vessel containing salt, to the CO.)

D.of C: The petitioners will stand round the Lodge Board, the Master and Wardens Designate in the East, all facing outwards.

(The D. of C then leads the Master Designate to his place, the others following - see diagram)

THE FOURTH CIRCUIT

The CO. now perambulates alone saying:(see diagram)

"I strew salt upon this Lodge, the emblem of fidelity, hospitality and everlasting friendship. May these virtues ever continue to distinguish the members of this Lodge until time with them shall be no more."

G. D. of C.: (C.O. returns to the East and stands facing or between SW and JW, as before). The brethren

will sing together.

Musical /

Omnes: "Glory be to God on High".

(The G. D. of C. receives the vessel of salt from the CO., and replaces it on the table. The CO.

and Wardens resume their places.)

G.D. of C: To Order brethren. (All give Sn. Of R.)

CO.: To God and his service I dedicate this Lodge (drop

Sn. of R.) Also to the memory of Adoniram under whose auspices many of our masonic mysteries

are said to have had their origin.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G.D. of C: Petitioners, resume your places but remain

standing.

(The G. D. of C. leads the Master and Wardens Designate to their places. All remain standing. The G. D. of C. or his Deputy having previously directed the Tyler to prepare the censer, obtains it from him. Chap. comes and stands in front of the CO. to receive the censer from the G.D. of C)

Perambulations

(The Chap, perambulations the Lodge three times in a slow march waving the censer so as to disperse the incense, reciting the following words in slow rhythm.)

First Perambulation (Censing the Lodge)

(The Chap, bows to the CO., turns right and proceeds down the Lodge, saying)

"And Aaron shall burn thereon sweet incense".

(He halts in front of the J.W., faces north and swings the censer twice, slowly walks over to the west, halts in front of the S.W., faces east and swings the censer twice; proceeds in a slow walk along the north, halts opposite and in line with the J.W.'s Chair, faces south and swings the censer twice. He then slowly walks over to the east, halts in front of the CO. and faces him. See Diagram)

Second Perambulation (Censing the CO.)

The Chap. bows to the CO., censes him three times and bows again. He then turns right and proceeds down the Lodge, reciting:

"Every morning, when he dresseth the lamps, he shall burn incense upon it"

(He halts in front of S.W., faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He continues round the lodge until he is in the N., Opposite the J.W. He halts, faces the J.W., bows, censes him once across and over the lodge board and bows again. He then goes back to his position in the E. (see diagram)

Third Perambulation (Censing the Master and Wardens Designate, and brethren generally)

(The Chap, bows to the CO., turns right and halts in front of the Master Designate, the S.W. Designate and J.W. Designate in that order on the front row at the East of J.W.'s pedestal. He faces the Master Designate, bows, censes him three times and bows again. He then moves to the front of the S.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He then moves to the front of the J.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him once and bows again. He then proceeds round the Lodge slowly reciting the following words)

"And when Aaron lighteth the lamps at even, he shall burn incense upon it.

(The Chap, proceeds to the West and halts in front of the S.W.'s pedestal facing east, he half turns to his right towards the south-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He next turns left towards North East, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He finally faces the East, bows, censes the brethren in the east once, he then proceeds onwards along the north reciting the following words, (See Diagram)

"A perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generation."

THE CEREMONY OF CONSECRATION OF A ROYAL ARK MARINERS LODGE

General Instructions:

- The Consecrating team is a Grand Mark Lodge team and shall therefore wear only the Grand Mark Lodge Regalia.
- The G.D. of C. will form the ingoing procession in accordance with the seniority of pro-tem office and not as per the seniority of individual rank)
- 3. The Consecrating Officer with the assistance of his team will open a casual R.A.M. Lodge. No separate team shall be formed for opening a casual R.A.M. Lodge. The Consecrating Officer, after occupying the Eastern Chair shall appoint the Protem Officers who will bow to the Consecrating Officer and proceed to their respective seats.
- In the opening Ceremony the consecrating Officer is to be addressed as W.C.N., and not as M.W., the Grand Master or R.W., the R.G.M.M., etc.
- The Consecrating Officer if he so desires, may address the brethren immediately after the Ceremony of Consecration, but before he hands over the charge to the Installing Officer.
- As the Consecrating Officers are relieved of their pro-tem offices, they will be seated on the dais on the right of the W.M. in accordance with their seniority and the regalia they are wearing.

- 7. After the installation, the W.C.N. should request any Past Commander to act as I.P.C., but will not invest him.
- Brethren will remain standing during the four Circuits and Censing of the R.A.M. Lodge right up to the Benediction Prayer.
- 9. The Treasurer and Tyler should be elected before the Investiture of Officers of the Lodge is taken up.
- The Bye-Laws of the Lodge should be first adopted in open Lodge before they are presented to the newly installed W.C.N.
- The G.D. of C., shall form the outgoing procession in accordance with the Seniority and the regalia worn by Consecrating Officers.

Requisites:

- 1. All normal properties and furniture of a R.A.M. Lodge.
- Consecrating vessels and censer (to be procured from respective R.G.Ls.)
- 3. Consecrating elements Corn, Wine, Oil and Salt.
- 4. Incense, Camphor and Match box.
- Two tables, one large one for the Mark Lodge Board and one small one for the consecrating vessels.
- Two white table cloths.
- Three Saucers with three small tables.
- 8. Charter or Warrant.
- 9. Mark Lodge Board.

 Book of Constitutions of G.M.L.I., Regional Grand Mark Lodge Bylaws, Bylaws of the Lodge (draft).

Seating Arrangement:

- Seats on the dais at the right of W.C.N, for Consecrating Officers.
- 2. Two seats in North-east for the G. D. of C. and his Dy.
- Seats for the petitioners in South-East and for the Commander and Wardens designate in front.

Ceremonial

G. D. of C. (At Lodge door): Upstanding Brethren to receive the Consecrating Officer, M.W./R.W. Bro....., accompanied by the Consecrating Officers.

(The Consecrating Officers, Juniors leading enter in pairs, open out, halt and turn inwards. The Consecrating Officer (C.O.) appoints his Officers, protem. Each in turn bows and proceeds direct to his place unescorted. The Consecrating Officer opens the Lodge. The Mark Tracing Board is not opened.)

C.O.: Brethren, we have assembled here for the laudable purpose of Consecrating a new R.A.M. Lodge and constituting it into a Lodge of Royal

Ark Mariners, so that it may act as a Regular Lodge and elevate brethren to the Degree of Royal Ark Mariners and perform rites and ceremonies conformably with our ancient usages and customs of the order as established and laid down by the laws and constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India. We are pleased and happy to have the opportunity to welcome this addition to our family. Before I proceed with the ceremony of consecration, I call upon the Chaplain to give the opening prayer.

G. D. of C.: To order brethren.

(All stand to order with Sn. of R.)

Prayer

Chap .:

O Lord our Heavenly Father, Architect and Ruler of the Universe, who dost from Thy throne behold all dwellers upon earth, direct us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Most Holy name.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G. D. of C.: Be seated brethren.

G. D. of C.: (from the West, and without sign, addresses the C.O.): Most Worshipful the C.O., a number of brethren who are well skilled in the mysteries and ceremonies of Royal Ark Masonry, having obtained from you, a Charter or Warrant of Constitution bearing the (date)...... corresponding to the day of Saka Era authorizing them to form and open a new Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners, to be styled as R.A.M. Lodge Lodge..... No. on the roll of the Antient and Honourable Fraternity of Mark Master Masons of India, are desirous that you should consecrate it, in order that they may be enabled to work as a regular body of Royal Ark Mariners conformably within the ancient usages and customs of , the Order as established and laid down by the laws and constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India for which purpose they are here assembled and await your

(If someone other than M.W. Grand Master is the C.O. for the words "Most Worshipful" substitute the words "Right Worshipful" and for the words "obtained from you" substitute the words "obtained from M.W. Grand Master".)

pleasure.

CO.: I will thank those brethren who have signed the Petition to stand in the body of the Lodge while the Scribe reads the Warrant.

G. D. of C.: The Petitioners will stand in the East, the Commander Noah Designate in front, with the S.W. Designate on his right, the J.W. Designate on his left, and the other Petitioners formed behind, all facing East.

(G.D. of C goes to the Commander Noah Designate and leads him to his place, the others following. He hands over the Warrant to the CO. for perusal and then hands it back to the Grand Scribe, who reads the Warrant)

CO.: After due consideration, I, as Grand Master, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India, have granted to the brethren of this new Lodge a Warrant establishing in them all the rights and privileges of our Order and I must now enquire of the Petitioners whether they approve of the officers named in the Warrant to preside over them

(If someone other than M.W. the Grand Master is the CO. for the words "I, as Grand Master, by virtue of the authority in me" substitute the words "Most Worshipful Grand Master by virtue of the authority in him" and substitute the word "have" by "has".

(The Petitioners, other than the Commander Noah and Wardens Designate, signify their approval by the Sn. of F.)

CO.: Then we will proceed to constitute these brethren into a regular Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners and to consecrate it in accordance with ancient usages and customs.

G. D. of C.: Petitioners, resume your seats. Be seated brethren (G. D. of C. leads the Commander Noah Designate to his seat)

CO.: I now call upon the Chaplain to deliver an Oration on the nature and purpose of our Institution.

THE ORATION

(Chap, delivers the Oration)

G. D. of C.: To order brethren for the first part of the Dedication Prayer. (All give Sn. of F.)

DEDICATION PRAYER, FIRST PART

Chap.: O! S.C.O.T.U., who has created all things out of nothing and who, for the sin of man, did once let loose the floodgates of the great deep, look down upon us who are about to consecrate

this Lodge to Thy service in commemoration of the miraculous escape of Noah. Endue us with such strength and wisdom from on high that we may show in all our words and actions the beauty of holiness, and be found worthy of that covenant and promise which Thou didst make with Thy faithful servants of old. To Thee, O Lord, we dedicate our works and to Thee be all the glory.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G. D. of C.: The brethren will turn to East and stand to order (Sn. of R.)

THE INVOCATION

CO.: O Lord God, Supreme Thou art in Heaven above and on earth beneath, who keepeth the covenant and showeth mercy unto Thy servants who bow before Thee with all their hearts.

Let all the people of the earth know that the Lord, He is God, and that there is none else. Let all the people of the earth know Thy name and revere Thee. Let all the people of the earth know that we have built this House and are consecrating it to Thy service.

But wilt Thou, O God, indeed, dwell upon the earth? Behold the heavens and the heaven of heavens cannot contain Thee, how much less this House that we have built? Yet we implore Thee to heed to our prayers and supplications, and hearken unto our cry.

May Thine eyes be opened towards this House by night as well as by day; and when Thy servants shall pray to Thee from this house, hearken unto their supplications, hear thou in heaven, Thy dwelling place and when Thou hearest, forgive.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

C.O.: Let the Lodge Board be uncovered. (G. D. of C. uncovers the Mark Tracing Board and he, or his Deputy takes out the covering cloth.)

G. D. of C.: Brother Wardens, will you please attend on the Consecrating Officer?

(The CO. places himself to the east of the Lodge Board, facing west with the S.W. on his right and the J.W. on his left. The G. D. of C. hands the cornucopia filled with corn to the CO., the vessel containing wine to the S.W. and that containing oil to the J.W. bowing to each after doing so.)

The First Circuit

C.O. (followed by the S.W. and J.W. in that order, perambulates saying): I scatter corn upon this Lodge, the symbol of abundance and plenty. May the good seed of His word sink into the hearts of men, take root and bring forth fruit a hundred fold.

G. D. of C. (When all three have returned to the east.): The brethren will now sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

The Second Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the cornucopia from the CO. and hands the vessel containing wine to the CO., the vessel containing oil to the S.W. and the cornucopia to the J.W. bowing to each after he has done so.)

C.O.: (followed by W.s. as before, perambulates saying):

I pour wine upon this Lodge, the symbol of joy and gladness: May we ever rejoice in the revelation of truth and may virtue flourish as the wine.

G. D. of C.: (When all three have returned to the east.):

The brethren will now sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

The Third Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the vessel containing wine from the CO. and hands over that containing oil to him, the vessel containing wine to the J.W. and the cornucopia to the S.W.)

C.O.: (followed by Ws.as before, perambulates saying):
I sprinkle oil upon this Lodge, the symbol of peace
and harmony. May the peace that passeth all
understanding descend from heaven upon you and
abide with you forevermore.

G. D. of C. : (When all three have returned to the east.): The Brethren will now sing together.

Musical/

Omnes: Glory be to God on High.

(The G. D. of C. receives the consecrating vessels from the CO. and the Wardens, and replaces them on the table.)

G. D. of C.: The petitioners will stand round the Lodge Board in the form of a triangle, Commander Noah and Wardens Designate in the East, all facing outwards.

(The G. D. of C. then leads the Commander Noah Designate to his place, the others following and

stand as per the diagram. (He then hands the vessel containing salt to the C.O.)

THE FOURTH CIRCUIT

C.O.: (now perambulates alone (see diagram), saying):

I strew salt on this Lodge, the emblem of fidelity,
hospitality and everlasting friendship. May these
virtues ever continue to distinguish the members
of this Lodge until time with them shall be no more.

G. D. of C.: (When the C.O. has returned to the E. and stands facings W. between S.W. and J.W. as before): The Brethren will now sing together.

Musical / Omnes:

"Glory be to God on High".

(G. D. of C. receives the vessel of salt from the CO., and replaces it on the table. The CO. and Wardens resume their places and remain standing.)

G.D. of C: To Order brethren. (All give Sn. of R.)

CO.: To God and his service I dedicate this Lodge (drop Sn. of F.) Also to commemorate the miraculous escape of Noah and his family from the overwhelming waters.

Omnes: S.M.I.B.

G.D. of C: Petitioners resume your places but remain standing. (The G. D. of C. leads the W.C.N. Designate to his place. and they remain standing. The G. D. of C. or his Deputy having previously directed the Warder to prepare the censer, obtains it. Chap. Comes and stands in front of the CO. to receive the censer from the D. of C)

Perambulations

(The Chap, perambulates the Lodge three times in a slow march waving the censer so as to disperse the incense, reciting the following words in slow rhythm.)

First Perambulation (Censing the Lodge)

(The Chap, bows to the CO., turns right and proceeds down the Lodge, saying)

"And Aaron shall burn thereon sweet incense".

(He halts opposite and in line with S.W. faces North West, swings the censer twice, slowly walks over to the West, halts in front of the Deacons, faces East, swings the censer twice, proceeds in a slow walk along north, halts opposite and in line with J.W.'s chair, faces south west and swings the censor twice. He then slowly walks over to the East, halts in front of the CO. and faces him. See diagram)

Second Perambulation (Censing the CO.)

The Chap. bows to the CO., censes him three times and bows again. He then turns right and proceeds down the Lodge, reciting:

"Every morning, when he dresseth the lamps, he shall burn incense upon it"

(He halts in front of S.W., faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He continues round the Lodge until he is in the north, opposite the J.W. He halts, faces the J.W., bows, censes him once across and over the Lodge Board, and bows again. He then goes back to his position in the east. See Diagram).

Third Perambulation (Censing the W.C.N. and Wardens Designate, and brethren generally)

The Chap, bows to the CO., turns right and halts in front of the W.C.N. Designate, the S.W. Designate and J.W. Designate in that order

on the front row. He faces the W.C.N. Designate, bows, censes him three times and bows again. He then moves to the front of the S.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He then moves to the front of the J.W. Designate, faces him, bows, censes him once and bows again. He then proceeds round the Lodge slowly reciting the following words:

"And when Aaron lighteth the lamps at even, he shall burn incense upon it."

(The Chap, proceeds to the West and halts in front of the Deacons facing E., he half turns to his right towards the south-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He next turns left towards north-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He finally faces the East, bows, censes the brethren in the east once, he then proceeds onwards along the north reciting the following words. See Diagram.)

"A perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generation."

(He comes back to his starting position in the east, faces the C.O., bows to him, hands the censer to the G. D. of C. and returns to his seat. The D. of C, or Deputy takes the censer out of the Temple.)

G. D. of C.: To order brethren, with the Sn. of F., for the second part of the Dedication Prayer.

Dedication Prayer, Second Part

Chap.:

O thou Great & Glorious Commander of heaven and earth, who of Thy great mercy didst save Noah and his family from the deluge, we humbly beseech Thee to give Thy blessing to those who are here assembled in Thy Holy Name. CEREMONY OF DEDICATION OF A LODGE BANNER

General Instructions:

- 1) The Lodge shall be opened in all the Three Degrees.
- R.W. The Regional Grand Master will enter the Lodge in Procession, he will be welcomed, greeted and saluted.
- M.W. The Grand Master (Dedicating Officer) will then enter the Lodge in Procession. He shall be welcomed, greeted and saluted.
- The Lodge shall be closed in Third and Second Degrees.
- The Dedication Ceremony shall be conducted in the First Degree
- 6) The Lodge shall ensure that the Banner contains all the features mentioned in the Explanation as far as possible.
- The Dedicating Officer shall appoint the Grand Wardens and Grand Chaplain to assist him in the Ceremony.
- Brethren remain standing from the opening prayer upto end of dedication prayer. Ceremony of Dedication of a Lodge Banner.

The D. of C. forms the procession in front of the I.P.M.'s chair as follows:

(The procession which commences from the front of I.P.M.'s seat, slowly goes round the Lodge once and proceeds further upto the J.W.'s pedestal and turns inwards towards North and again inwards towards East and proceeds to the East. The procession halts in front of and at a short distance from the W.M.'s pedestal. The banner bearers move ahead and halt in front of the W.M.)

(The D. of C, assisted by the two Banner Bearers and Stewards, fixes the banner at its place behind the W.M.'s chair, in readiness for the unveiling. Members of the procession resume their seats.)

W.M.: M. W. The Grand Master, I now request you formally to unveil and dedicate the banner.

(The W.M. then offers the gavel to the D.O. The D.O. occupies the Eastern Chair. The W.M. takes a chair to the left of the D.O. The D.O. requests the Grand Wardens and Grand Chaplain to assume charge. The G.D. of C. places the Grand Wardens and Grand Chaplain in their respective places.)

D.O.: I now call upon the Chaplain for the benefit of prayer.

G. D. of C.: To order brethren. (All stand with Sn. of R.)

Prayer

G. Chap.: O Lord our Heavenly Father, Architect and Ruler of the Universe, who dost from Thy throne behold all dwellers upon earth: we beseech Thee to bless and hallow this banner, which we here consecrate as a symbol of our masonic fellowship, and to the honour and glory of Thy Most Holy Name. Grant to all who gather beneath its shadow, wisdom to teach, humility to learn, and grace to fulfill their obligations. Pour down upon them, and upon all the members of our fraternity, the continual dew of Thy blessings that we may daily increase in love of Thee and one another. 
Explanation of the Banner by the W.M.

The pillars, the sun and the moon, the square and compasses, the checkered floor, the All-seeing Eye and such other symbols are constituents of a Lodge banner and I need hardly dwell here upon the significance of these symbols. Besides them, there are certain special features of this Lodge banner. (Here explain the specific features of this banner. If the banner has been presented by anyone, if may be mentioned here.) Finally, may I submit that in essence, the banner before you, represents the tools in masonry, our urges and aspirations and the masonic resolve in defense of all that is good and sublime and worthy of preserving and sustaining, I therefore conclude with the hope that it will ever remind us and those who follow us to keep on drawing the necessary inspiration from it and prove worthy of the fold.

Brethren, we have now witnessed a ceremony which will have an effect, deep and lasting, as long as the banner now presented and dedicated is in being or the record of these proceedings remain. We shall record in our minutes an acknowledgement of our gratitude to M. W. The Grand Master, M. W. Bro., for unveiling the banner and for the service of Dedication; and to his officers for assisting him.

The origin of the banner goes back to remote antiquity. Let it ever be the rallying point for members of this Lodge, for it symbolizes loyalty, fidelity and unity. The spirit of unity and concord, of wisdom and beauty, and of true craftsmanship is demonstrated before us in this banner. May it ever remind us of the fraternal affection which does, and ever should, animate masons in all places and at all times. May the symbols illustrated upon it lead us to seek the highest ideals and direct our actions in harmonious relations with all men, and enable us to prove to the world the happy and beneficial effects of our ancient and honourable institution.

- Before the Ceremony, W. Master and R.W. The Regional Grand Master will welcome M.W. The Grand Master(Dedicating Officer).
- M.W. The Grand Master (Dedicating Officer) will address the Lodge before handing over charge of the Lodge back to W. Master after the Ceremony.

CEREMONIAL

W.M. hands over charge of the Lodge to the Dedicating Officer (D.O.) who will appoint his officers and address the brethren as follows:

(followed by S.W. and J.W. in that order, perambulates saying): I scatter corn upon this Temple, the symbol of plenty and abundance; and may The All Bounteous Creator of the Universe shower His choicest blessings on the members of this community and all who shall assemble in this building to the glory of the Most High, until time shall be no more.

(Arriving at the East, the D.O. and Wardens stand facing west.)

D.O.: I now dedicate this Temple to Freemasonry, to the service of the G.A.O.T.U., to the purposes of that Great Brotherhood which seeks by faith

in God to promote goodwill among men, and to inculcate the purest principles of piety and virtue.

G. D. of C.: The brethren will now sing together.

Second Circuit

(The G. D. of C. takes the cornucopia from the D.O. and hands the vessel containing wine to the D.O., the vessel containing oil to the S.W. and the cornucopia to the J.W. bowing to each after doing so.)

Fourth Circuit

(The Director of Ceremonies receives the consecrating vessels from the D.O., the Senior Warden and Junior Warden and replaces them on the table. He then hands the vessel containing salt to the D.O.)

(Arriving at the East, the DO stands facing West with Wardens.)

D. of C. having previously directed the Tyler to prepare the censer, gives it to the Chap, who receives it in front of the D.O.'s pedestal. The Chap, takes it three times round the Lodge, waving it so as to disperse the incense, (see Diagram) reciting slowly)

First Perambulation (Censing the Lodge)

(The Chap, bows to the D.O., turns right and proceeds down the Lodge reciting the following words in slow rhythm.)

"And Aaron shall burn thereon sweet incense".

(He halts in front of the J.W., faces north and swings the censer twice, slowly walks over to the west, halts in front of the S.W., faces east and swings the censer twice; proceeds in a slow walk along the north, halts opposite and in line with the J.W.'s Chair, faces south and swings the censer twice. He then slowly walks over to the east, halts in front of the D.O. and faces him – see Diagram)

Second Perambulation (Censing the D.O.)

(The Chap, bows to the D.O., censes him three times and bows again. He then turns right and proceeds down the Lodge reciting the following words in slow rhythm)

"Every morning when he dresseth the Lamps, he shall burn incense upon it."

(He halts in front of S.W., faces him, bows, censes him twice and bows again. He continues round the Lodge until he is in the north, opposite the J.W. He halts, faces the J.W., bows, censes him once, and bows again. He then goes back to his position in the east – see Diagram).

Third Perambulation (Censing the brethren generally)

(The Chap, bows to the D.O., turns right and proceeds round the Lodge slowly reciting the following words in slow rhythm)

"And when Aaron lighteth the lamps at even, he shall burn incense upon it."

(The Chap, proceeds to the West and halts in front of the S.W.'s pedestal facing east, he half turns to his right towards the south-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He next turns left towards north-east, bows to the brethren on that side, censes them once and bows again. He finally faces the East, bows, censes the brethren in the east once, he then proceeds onwards along the north reciting the following words in slow rhythm – see Diagram)

"A perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generation."

(He comes back to his starting position in the east, faces the D.O., bows to him, hands the censer to the G. D. of C. and returns to his seat. The G. D. of C. or his Deputy takes the censer out of the Temple.)

G. D. of C.: To order, brethren (Sn. of R.)

Chap .:

Grant, O Most High, that all those who shall bear office in this Temple may be endued with wisdom to instruct their brethren in all their duties. - Memorial Service can be held only for Master Masons and above and not for Fellow Craft Freemason & Entered Apprentice Freemasons.
- If the roll of Master Masons is very long, a few selected names can be called, particularly of the deceased brother's contemporaries and all those members present.
- 8. The oration should be given from South-East corner.
- Candle Bearers and Bearers of Vs of S.L. remain out till D of C conducts them inside.

- Bearer of Vs of S.L. will carry Vs of S.L. of the faith of the deceased Brother.
- While retiring the W.M. moves first accompanied by M.W. the Grand Master, R.W. The Regional Grand Master and followed by other brethren and visitors.
- 12. The Tyler's Toast is a solemn toast taken at long table with brethren remaining standing round the table and utilizing a small glass containing wine or any other dark coloured soft drink not exceeding 50 ml.
- 13. Black rosettes should be used by all brethren.

(The National Anthem is not to be sung/played.)


